ON-GOING PROJECTS

"MELIA": Mediterranean Dialogue on Integrated Water Management

- Promoted by "Consejo Superior de Investigaciones Científicas" (CSIC) and the International Center for Med. Agronomic Studies (CIHEAM-IAMB)
- Objective: create an efficient regional management of water resources under scarcity conditions and to improve communication amongst Mediterranean countries.
- Started in September 2006





ON-GOING PROJECTS

SPI-Water: Setting up a mechanism to enhance the use of RTD tools and extend the implementation of the WFD to non-EU countries

- MENBO is the leader of working group related to the EUWI (pilote river basins: Sebou, Morocco and Litani, Lebanon)
- Kick off meeting celebrated in Brussels in November 2006

NEXT EVENTS


- Autumn 2007: MENBO will celebrate its 5th

- New president of the Network will be elected




MENBO MEMBERS
