



Who are we?


Open network of research programme managers (IWRM) composed of 21 members from 14 members states

- The facilitator between researchers and water policy makers and managers to bridge the communication gap.





- FORECASTER: Facilitating the application of Output from Research and CAse STudies on Ecological Responses to hydro-morphological degradation and rehabilitation
- KNAC: Knowledge in Action in the Rhine river basin hydromorphological restructuring
- Riparian vegetation modelling for the assessment of environmental flow regimes and climate change impacts within the WFD (RIPFLOW)

 IWRM for climate change adaptation in rural social ecosystems Southern Europe (Italy, Portugal, Spain)




Scientific Coordination Project
