

# \* Korea's Water Sector Achievements




- GNI per capita: US\$85 (1961) → US\$26,204 (2012)
- Water supply coverage: from 17% (1961) to 98% (2012)
- Wastewater services coverage: from 2% (1961) to 92% (2012)
- Proper accounting of all costs and revenues of the sector since early reform

#### (Key Success Factors)

- ➤ Government-initiated financial investment
- ➤ Importance of investing in human resource development to foster national economic growth


- Statutory and Mandatory Employee Training Programs (by Acts)



  - Water expert DB & Water Industry Academy (KWWA)


