Water doesn't know borders! Approximately 40 per cent of the world's population lives in river and lake basins that comprise two countries or more. Over 275 transboundary lake and river basins cover nearly one half of the Earth's land surface and account for an estimated 60 per cent of global freshwater flow.

Improving the way we manage transboundary water resources is therefore a necessity. The final session of theme 4.3 aims at giving an overview of how we can get there. Key messages expressed during the sessions organized on that matter throughout the forum will be discussed.

How can water diplomacy be best conducted? What are the existing legal instruments at global and regional levels that can support that effort? How can we create and develop transboundary basin organisations and make sure they get sustainable funding? Thanks to contributions from all over the world, this concluding session should help get recommendations to these important challenges.
