Concluding session 4.3: Cooperation for Reducing Conflict and Improving Transboundary Water management

Session description* (180 words, please kindly use media-friendly language)

Throughout human history, rivers, lakes and aquifers have served as important sources for human life and activities. Water is a resource without borders. Worldwide, there are 276 transboundary river basins and so far 608 transboundary aquifers identified by IGRAC center and the ISARM program. Climate change coupled with demographic and socio-economic trends are putting water resources under increasing stress. More than before, coordination among riparian countries is essential to strengthen a sustainable management and protection of transboundary water resources.

The final session of theme 4.3 aims at giving an overview of how we can get there. Key messages emerged from the 4.3 thematic sessions will be discussed and pave the way towards implementing cooperative mechanisms for a sustainable transboundary water management. How can water diplomacy be best conducted? How can existing international and regional legal instruments and data exchanges frameworks between riparian countries support that effort? How can we create and strengthen transboundary basin organisations and make sure they get sustainable funding? How can an intersectoral approach enhance a sound and efficient transboundary management of water resources?
