

Mission Statement:

Facilitate the implementation of effective IWRM programmes on national and transnational rivers of Africa, through coordinated financing, technical support, dialogue and partnerships.

Work with riparian Governments and others stakeholders to establish and/or strengthen river basin management institutions and programmes.





Objectives:

Build on existing programmes in Africa selected by our African partners through a multi-stakeholder approach and a concrete action plan.

- Link closely with the Initiatives taken by the African Minsterial Conference on Water (AMCOW) and the African Water Task Force
- Use the valuable principles and practical guidelines of the European Water Framework Directive ?





MINISTÈRE DES AFFAIRES ÉTRANGÈRES

- Suggested focus:
 - → Dissemination of of internationally agreed principles,
 - → Develop funds to implement IWRM programmes under river organizations,
- → Fund institutions in charge of transboundary waters
 - → Explore within mature river basin organizations new financing mechanisms,
 - → Support consultation of civil society on a rights based approach.

First step of the action plan of this post-WSSD design phase:

Assessment

Set-up a "clearing house" on IWRM/ transboundary water interventions in Africa (National/Regional)

(Benchmark "starting point", gaps)

Operator: International Water Office

Means: Detailed questionnaire

Target: by the end of October: achieved






EUROPEAN COUNTRIES AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS INVOLVED IN IWRM IN AFRICA
