international coopération on the river Rhine: an ancient history

The first main difficulty to be dealt with:
obstacle to navigation to be removed

A first Treaty: 1668

Excerpts from the Wesphalien Treaty1648

- From now on, let traffic and passages be free to the inhabitants of one and the other bank of the Rhine, and adjacent provinces;
- it is not allowed to any party to restrain, stop, on any pretext whatsoever passers boats,
- It will not be allowed to establish on the Rhine new taxes, tolls, ...

How to make it work?

- A common will =>
 - But : not really implementation
- 1668/1815 a lots of new treaties to make it work
 - To no avail
- 1815: the central Commission for navigation in the Rhine
 - to manage the implementation of the decisions
 - First International river Commission in the world

Deep Changes, for the better, or?....



A new commission for the protection of the river

- 1950 first meeting
- 1963 first international convention : main objectives :
 - chemical pollution
 - thermal pollution
 - chloride pollution
- Good results with chemical pollution,
- Less in other fields, but......

The commission allows a quick reaction to important events

December 1986: a fire in the swiss chemical plant SANDOZ causes an important pollution and an important pressure from public opinion





- immediate action could be taken by the commission
- <u>▶ 1987 1999</u>: action takes then an more political dimension:

Ministers held regular meetings and decided on a plan of action

(= before the European framework directive)

Among the results


- Organic and nitrogenous pollution are under control
- Reduction from 80% to 50% of toxic pollution
- Migratory fishes and especially the salmon are back

What is made possible in a Commission?

A process that happens in stages:

- 1) Set objectives = what we want
- 2) Identify the problems to be resolved = what are the key questions to be dealt with
- 3) Elaborate strategies = action plan
- 4) Implement
- 5) Assess the results (revise the plan to make it more effective)

An iterative process
