How the two global water conventions support transboundary water cooperation

Two global legal frameworks now foster cooperation between countries, sectors and other stakeholders in transboundary basins: the 1997 UN Watercourses Convention enters into force and the 1992 UNECE Water Convention or Helsinki Convention is opened for worldwide accession. They support countries in creating adequate basin governance structures, preventing conflicts and addressing challenges such as balancing multiple water uses or climate change adaptation. Their implementation can be fostered through tools such as the TWAP, which helps to identify priorities for action.
