 - Signing of a new Africa-EU Strategic partnership on water affairs and sanitation
 - Agreement with 12 countries in Eastern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia




EU contribution to the water-related EU WATER INITIATIVE Millennium Development Goals

- Halve, by the year 2015, the proportion of people without access to safe drinking water
 - every day until 2015, an extra 120,000 people should receive drinking water
- Halve, by the year 2015, the proportion of people who do not have access to basic sanitation
 - every day until 2015, an extra 240,000 people should be provided with sanitation
- Develop integrated water resources management and efficiency plans by 2005 Return


