CONTEXT:

Since the adoption of the Water Framework Directive (WFD) in the European Union (EU), significant progress have been made towards a more inclusive decision-making process. The Directive introduces the obligation for all Member States to encourage an active, participatory management of water resources at basin level.

But the degree of participatory management vary greatly in the legal and institutional frameworks established at national (or transboundary!) level, from simply ensuring consultation and access to background information to co-designing River Basin Management Plans (RBMPs) with a wide-range of public and private actors.

This session will present how participatory management can be improved at each of step of the WFD process for river basin management planning: how can water users and the public at large can be better involved in monitoring, diagnosis, planning and implementation?
