CONTEXT:

Climate change primarily affects our societies through the water cycle: unpredictable rainfall patterns, aquatic ecosystems degradation, altered river flows, sea level rise-induced salinization of coastal groundwater and more frequent and intense floods and droughts. In Europe, these climate change impacts further limit the capacity of EU Member States to achieve the WFD objectives.

But cooperating for adaptation to climate change at basin level is part of the solution. Basin organizations, both at national and transboundary levels, are showing us how to meet the challenge, by opting for cooperation through the elaboration of coordinated development plans at the scale of hydrographic district and with the integration of all water uses and climate change impacts.

This session will present how cooperation and planning of water resources uses at basin level helps to improve adaptation (but also avoid maladaptation!) and achieve the objectives of the Water Framework Directive.
