

GROWING PRESSURE ON TRANSBOUNDARY WATERS – YET FEW FRAMEWORKS FOR COOPERATION ARE IN PLACE





- **310 transboundary river basins** and more than 500 transboundary **aquifers**
- TB river basins cover 47.1% of the land surface and host about half of the world's population
- Development, population and climate mean increasing reliance on transboundary waters
- By 2050, 50 to 100% more people could live in water-stressed transboundary basins compared to today
- Shared waters can elicit conflict or cooperation
- Transboundary cooperation key for provision of Global Public Goods like climate resilience, conflict prevention, biodiversity preservation

Around **two-thirds** of the world's transboundary rivers – and many more aquifers - do not have a cooperative management framework

CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES REQUIRE BOLD, COORDINATED ACTION



GLOBAL FACILITY EOR TRANSBOUNDARY WATER COOPERATION

A resource for countries needing assistance around transboundary dialogue and engagement

- Advances development and climate change mitigation and adaptation for low and middleincome countries through transboundary water management and cooperation
- Develops targeted knowledge, tools and operational modalities, including financing for riparian dialogue and action
- Complements and amplifies existing regional programs from the World Bank and partners in this space, strengthened by global experience sharing and mobilization



ADVANCE GLOBAL DIALOGUE AND ACTION



Facility could include a **global delivery platform** too ensure coordination, learning and complementary work in shaping the global agenda among new and existing partners

PROPOSED TYPES OF GLOBAL CONVENING

GCWSP GLOBAL WATER SECURITY & SANITATION PARTNERSHIP

A **High-Level Advisory Committee** could come together to review global transboundary water risks and opportunities, and to explore opportunities for all partners to better support to transboundary water cooperation. The key functions of the Advisory Committee for Transboundary Waters will be:

- Promote the advancement of transboundary water management and cooperation.
- Highlight effective and/or innovative efforts in support of transboundary cooperation.
- Enhance collaboration and mobilize partners.

A **Global Expert Panel** could comprise of globally renowned transboundary waters experts with due consideration to diversity and regional representation in this panel, as well as gender balance.

A **Transboundary Waters Forum** for all partners, to explore transboundary risks and opportunities, methodologies and approaches for advancing cooperation. Held every 2-3 years.

by financing the preparation of transboundary waters investments and potentially offering products to minimize risk to investments or other agreements


